## **Illinois Eye-Bank's Eye Donor Month calendar spotlights local residents**

CHICAGO – Residents from all over Illinois are showing their support for eye, organ and tissue donation in honor of National Eye Donor Month this March.

The Illinois Eye-Bank has created a March calendar featuring the photos of more than 30 Illinois residents who made their desire to be a donor known by signing up on the Illinois Organ/Tissue Donor Registry. The calendar also offers facts and action items regarding donation and eye health.

"The action items are easy things people can do to support our mission during Eye Donor Month," explains Mary Schlereth, the Illinois Eye-Bank's Community Engagement Coordinator. "Inviting a family member to join the Donor Registry, for example, takes very little time, but has the potential to save lives and eyesight."
